Mr. Gregory Hartman began Government service in 2005 as a Computer Scientist assigned to the RDECOM CERDEC Software Engineering Directorate at Fort Monmouth, NJ. He was assigned to PM DCGS-A in support of Requirements and Architecture analysis. In 2006, Mr. Hartman was assigned to manage and lead DCGS-A and Future Combat Systems Interoperability efforts. In 2008, Mr. Hartman was assigned to PM DCGS-A, PdM DCGS-A Mobile Systems as the software lead for the Mobile Basic program.

In 2009, Mr. Hartman was permanently re-assigned to PEO IEW&S, PM DCGS-A as an Electronics Engineer. In 2010, he became the lead system engineer for PM DCGS-A, Product Manager, DCGS-A Mobile Systems providing day-to-day technical leadership for the DCGS-A Software Baseline

1.0 program through its DAE-approved Milestone C and Full Deployment Decision and he held this position until May 2013.

In May 2013, Mr. Hartman was assigned as the Chief Engineer for PM DCGS-A, providing oversight and strategic direction for all technical efforts across the DCGS-A portfolio. In 2015, he also accepted the responsibility of the Technical Director for PM DCGS-A, unifying the strategic and tactical engineering activities for the DCGS-A program.

In May 2019, Mr. Hartman was selected as the Deputy Project Manager for PM DCGS-A, providing overarching leadership and direction to projects assigned to the ACAT I DCGS-A portfolio.

Mr. Hartman earned his Bachelor Degree in Computer Science, with a Minor in Economics from the Pennsylvania State University in 2005. He earned his Master's Degree from Monmouth University in Software Engineering in 2008. Mr. Hartman is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps and is Level III Certified in System Engineering and Level II Certified in Program Management. He served six years in the ACAT I Key Leadership Position for PM DCGS-A as the Program Lead System Engineer and currently serves as the Key Leadership Position Deputy Project Manager. He completed the Civilian Education System Advanced Course in 2015.

Mr. Hartman's civilian awards include two Commander's Awards for Civilian Service, two Superior Civilian Service Awards, two Team C4ISR Top-10 personnel of the year awards, and the Knowlton Award for his contributions to Army Military Intelligence.
